### Key facts:

- Fun, youthful fashion designs were popularized by the 'Swinging London'.
- The national curriculum was introduced in September 1989, before teachers would choose what to teach.
- One of the first electronic toys
  was an electronic train invented in
  1901 called the Electric Express.
- Made in 200 the worlds most expensive Teddy bear sold for \$2.1 million by Steiff and Louis Vuitton.
- In 1970 the first home video was invented by Nolan Bushnell.

The past 100 years has seen the fastest progress in technology that has changed every aspect of our everyday lives.

### Learning Journey—

Through this topic pupils will develop historical enquiry skills and be asked to make inferences and explain their thinking. Pupils will use a variety of historical sources to find out about school life, fashion, toys and technology over the past century.

The children will begin by exploring the life in school through different decades by talking to people about their experiences when they were 6 years old. We will also be learning about fashion and toys through a variety of sources that children can touch and see to understand how technology has shaped these industries.
