In today's session we are going to create a story map of The Detective Dog. A story map can help us remember the story and focus on the different parts that make up the structure of the story. Using the story map sheet, create your own story map of The Detective Dog. Think of the key points in the story, draw the pictures and write sentences to explain the key point.	In today's session we are focusing on the illustrations. Who can remember what an illustration is? What details can you spot? What about the colours? Looking at the copies of illustrations, think about what you notice and what you like about them. Now choose your favourite illustration. This is the one you will be writing about. You will need to produce a short description of the illustration using interesting adjectives.	In today's session you will be creating your own character based on one from The Detective Dog. Re read The Detective Dog. Let's look at the character Nel and the thief. <i>What do we think about them Individually? What words can we use to describe them? What makes Nel different to other detectives?</i> You need to create your own character, you can either create a detective or a thief. Think about <i>What will they look like? Will the detective be a different type of animal? What will their name be?</i> Make sure you add expanded noun phrases and adverbs.	In today's session we are going to be writing a description of a setting. You can choose one of the settings from the book. These are all familiar settings to us. Our options are a classroom, the woods, and a library. Remember to focus on: <i>What could you smell? What could you see? What could you hear? What could you touch? Could you taste anything?</i> Make sure you include expanded noun phrases and adverbs if possible.	For our exciting writing this week you need to write descriptively. In English this week we have written descriptively in different ways, but we have included adjectives and expanded noun phrases in all of them. Using the image, can you write using your five senses. Make sure you are writing in full sentences and as descriptively as possible.
