This week we will be writing a news article about the events of 'Tuesday'. Look at the last few pages, in which pigs begin to fly. Follow the lesson presentation and explore the difference between fact, opinion and fantasy. Activity 1. Make a mind map of suggestions of things the pigs might get up to while they are flying. Who are the witnesses? What is the evidence they left behind? Activity 2. Think like a reporter- what are the facts of the story? Underline the provable facts in your mind map. Activity 3. Use the planning template to plan your article. What will the key facts be? Make sure you can answer the key questions- What, who, where, when and how. Challenge: Create a formal vocabulary list for yourself by re-reading some of the articles from 18.11.21. Magpie useful sentence starter and phrases to use in your own writing.	Spag starter-Passive sentence structures. Follow the lesson presentation to write the beginning of your report. The first paragraph of your news story is the most important part, and should give an overview of the key ideas of the article. Re-read the beginnings of a few of the articles you studied last week. How much can you understand from reading only the headline and the first paragraph? Activity 1. Write the first paragraph of your news article, answering the main questions- What, who, where, when and how. Challenge- Use your self-assessment criteria as you go to make sure you are using the features of a news article. Activity 2. You can also begin your next paragraphs, introducing a quote from one of your witnesses. Use the self-assessment criteria to help you. Self- assessment. Read carefully through your work and look for evidence to tick off each of your success criteria.	Spag starter- Semicolons. Today your task is to complete your news article using your plan. Follow the lesson presentation and look at the inverted pyramid of journalism. In a news story, you should convey the key facts right away, then fill in other information later. Activity 1. Continue your report using the information from your plan and your self- assessment criteria. Year 6 should ensure you have used direct speech to quote one witness in their own words, then used reported speech to explain what two further witnesses saw. Activity 2. Complete your report by writing a concluding paragraph. You should bring the story up to the present date by explaining what happened next, or is happening now. Challenge: Evaluate writing a news article compared to other kinds on non-fiction, such as a balanced argument or a non-chronological report. What do you like or dislike about this text type?
