<p>Today is World Poetry Day. To celebrate we are going to be exploring a range of poems and discussing the different themes and features.</p> <p>Work through the PowerPoint, and then look at the range of poems on the website, or if you have any poetry books at home have a look through them.</p> <p>Can you work out what type of poem it is, identify key themes or features, and discuss whether you like it or don't.</p> <p>Write a couple sentences explaining what your favourite poem is and why.</p>	<p>This week we will be writing our own poem all about Easter or Spring.</p> <p>Today we will be building our descriptive vocabulary and creating a word bank to use within our poem.</p> <p>Work through the PowerPoint.</p> <p>Activity: Look at the variety of images on the website. Can you write descriptive words and expanded noun phrases when looking at these images? Create your own word bank. Make sure you are including alliteration. Don't forget think about synonyms and always use WOW words.</p>	<p>Today we will be writing our poem, using the word bank we created yesterday.</p> <p>Work through the PowerPoint to understand the structure of a Kenning, then decide what you will be writing your Kenning about.</p> <p>It could be about Easter or Spring in general or about specific items such as Easter Eggs, Spring flowers, the Easter Bunny etc.</p> <p>Make sure you give your Kenning a title, and can you include alliteration?</p> <p>Once you have written it read through it. Would re-ordering the kennings make the poem flow better?</p>	<p>Today we will be editing our British Science Week Double Page.</p> <p>Your teacher will send you a copy of your exciting writing.</p> <p>Work through the PowerPoint to remind yourself of the editing stations.</p>	<p>Today we will be watching a Puffin Live Lesson.</p> <p>This is a live lesson with Chris Smith who is an author.</p> <p>You can sign up to watch the lesson here: Virtual Visit Webinar: Chris Smith, author of Frankie Best Hates Quests - Puffin Schools</p> <p>Don't forget to have a piece of paper and pencil close by so you can complete activities as the live lesson is happening.</p>
