Can you identify the subject and verb in each one?  Activity 2: Read through the extract from Goodnight Mr Tom. Use highlighters to identify the subject and verb of each sentence.  Remember, the subject can be more than one word or even a whole phrase!  Plenary: Identify subject and verb of sentences in 'The Jabberwocky'. Can you identify what job each word does, even if they are unfamiliar?  Read up to the end of Chapter 8 in Goodnight Mr Tom.	Can you explain what a noun is? Create a definition for nouns, and think of examples of different types of noun. Then think of definitions for different word types.  Activity 1: Look at the picture given in the lesson presentation. Compose simple sentences about what you see in the picture. After that, challenge yourself to extend your sentences by joining clauses together, or adding noun phrases or adverbial phrases.  Activity 2: Read and two paragraphs of Goodnight Mr Tom with the punctuation removed. Your job is to edit the text, deciding where sentences need to end by identifying the subjects and verbs. Then add full stops and Capital letters.  Read up to the end of Chapter 9 in Goodnight Mr Tom.	For World Book Day, complete 2-3 of the following activities.  • Hold a reading of your favourite books with your family. Explain why you like these books or authors. Which part of the story did you choose?  • Design an alternative cover for your favourite book, and write a blurb to convince others to give it a try.  • Write a tweet to convince Mr Greenham to read your favourite Michael Morpurgo novel.  • World Book Day reading comprehension.
