Learning Journey—

We will be exploring the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age periods.

We will look at what made these periods in history special exploring the discoveries and inventions. We will look at what cave men were really like and discover what it would have been like to live in those times.

The children will develop their history skills by exploring how Britain changed in this time, and will work on their comparison skills.

In Geography we will be focusing on surviving monuments from the Stone, Bronze and Iron age periods, and locating these on a map. We will be exploring using atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping.
