

# The Romans



#### **Interesting facts:**

- Rome was founded in 753BC by its first king,
   Romulus. It grew into a rich and powerful city during the next few hundred years.
- By AD 117 the Roman Empire included the whole of Italy, all the lands around the Mediterranean and much of Europe, including England, Wales and parts of Scotland.
- The Romans would have baths together. To keep clean the Romans would go to communal baths that means big baths where everyone would get in together.
- The Romans sometimes used powdered mouse brains as toothpaste!
- At one banquet in Rome, the guests were served with hundreds of ostrich brains!
