Computing YR2

LO: To consolidate my base level understanding of Block Coding.

Using espresso coding, complete the espresso Block Coding Level 1 refresher (located in Level 2). The videos will explain how to complete each task. The link and a picture of where to find the activities are below. There are three short lessons to complete in the refresher.

Your children should be able to follow this with minimal support.

Music

LO: Learn about drones and ragas and improvise a solo.

Watch the BBC Ten Pieces video from last week again about Ravi Shankar. We are learning about **ragas** and **drones**. Using one of the free xylophones online or a tuned instrument if you have one, compose a short piece of music using just the notes of the raga. You may also use Garageband or ChromeLab.

RE

LO: To understand where and how Sikhism was founded.

Last week you researched and create a general presentation/poster about Sikhism. Can you complete the attached KWL grid for Sikhism? Remember to leave the last column as we will fill this in at the end of the unit.

Watch Sikhism Lesson 1 about the story of Guru Nanak and complete the activity attached. You need to retell the story of how Sikhism was founded. Pick the level of difficulty that you think you can manage – use the pictures to help you!

Watch Mother Teresa Lesson 1 and make some notes about what you learn.


Try to organise your information into the subheadings:
