### **HENRY PURCELL 1659-1694**




Continuing with our lessons about Henry Purcell, who was a British composer from the 1600's, we are going to learn some body percussion and read some notation to go with a phrase of the tune. We are also going to learn about **rondo**. Rondo (or Rondeau) is a music shape with a recurring theme. The theme is alternated with contrasting 'episodes'. When you listen to the piece, can you identify the contrasting 'episode'. It is a variation of the initial part.



X4 means you need to clap and/or say "This is a rhythm to clap" 4 times. This whole piece (Part A) is played 5 times in the piece of music. If you have some pitched instruments you could have a go at the notation below.



Some of you may be able to play the whole phrase on pitched instruments as notated below. You could also try using Garageband or Chrome Band Lab.
