Task 1: As a class, come up with a list of as many different types of historical evidence as possible. Some examples could be: Diary, portraits, Wikipedia, adverts, graffiti, textbooks, court records or artefacts.

Then, decide if each is a **primary** source, or a **secondary** source.

Extension: Explain which piece of evidence, in your opinion, would be most useful to a historian.

Task 2: In pairs, you will explore four sets of pictures, each of Kimbolton village.

The picture sets were produced in 1880 (best estimate), 1904, 1955 and 1965.

Your task is to try to notice what has changed and stayed the same between each set of pictures.

Try to think of an explanation for each change that makes sense. If you can't think of why something has changed, this could become a research question for later.

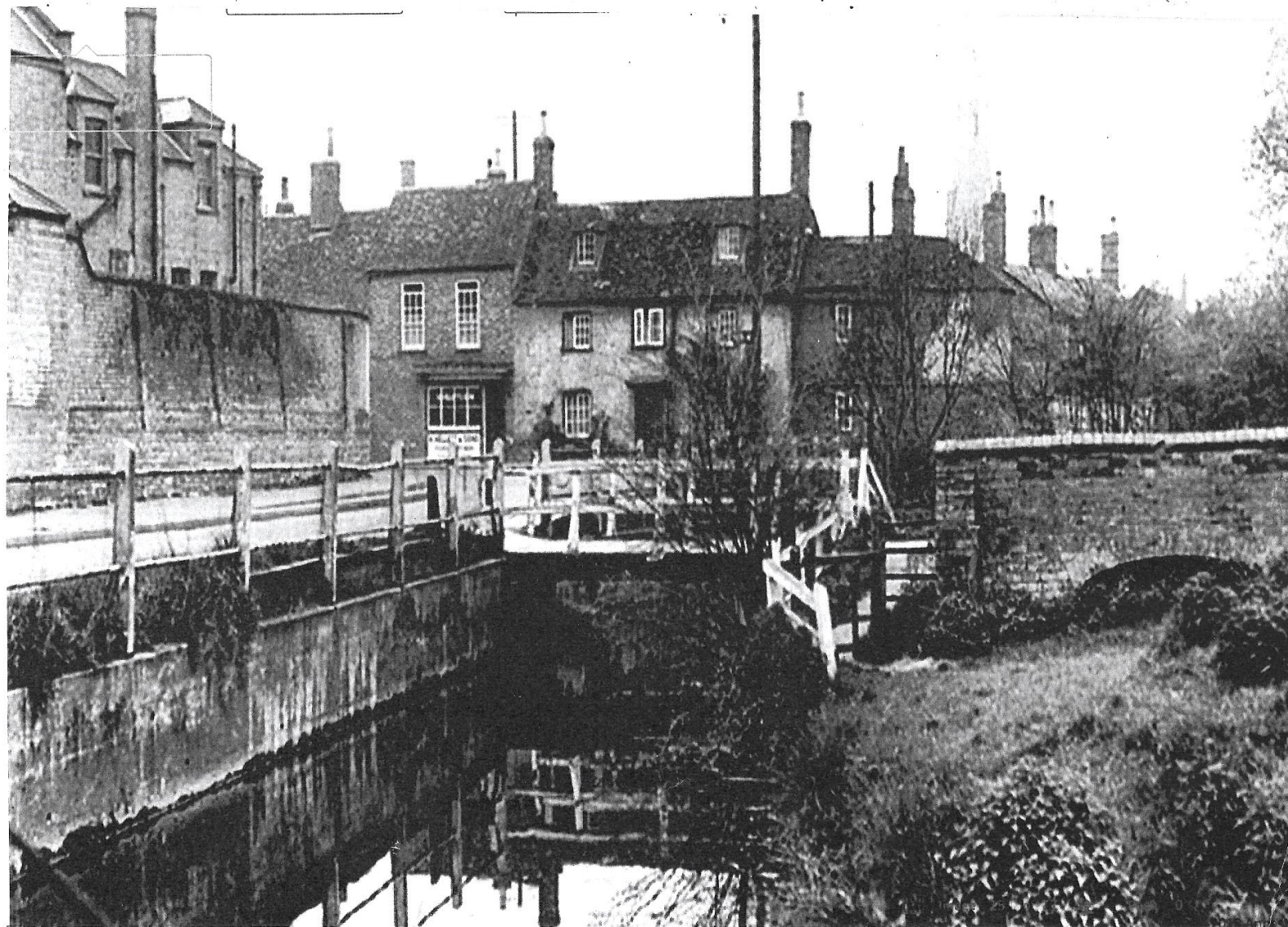
