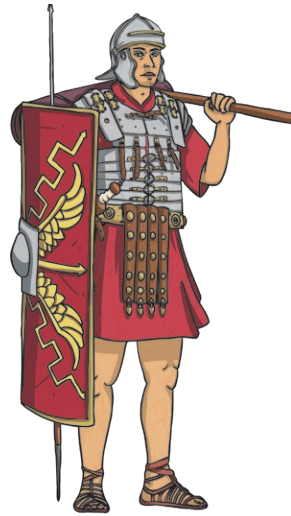


Equestrians
