

Year 4 Home Learning for Week Commencing 29th November 2021



Science

LO: I can explore how sound changes over a distance.

Follow the lesson presentation 'String Telephone' to find out how sound travels through solids, liquid and gas.

Activity 1: Use an object which makes noise, like a radio or alarm clock. Try listening to it from 1m away, then increase the distance. What do you notice about the sound as you move further away? Why do you think this is? Draw and label a diagram to explain how distance affects sound.

Activity 2: Follow the instructions in the lesson presentation to create a string telephone using string and disposable cups. Working with a partner, stand 10m apart and speak at normal volume. Can you hear each other clearly? Try again speaking at the same volume using the string telephone. What do you notice?

Challenge: Write a paragraph to explain how sound travels through the string telephone and what effect this has on distance.

Optional Task: Research how whales are able to communicate over long distances using whale song.
