- Be clear about the key events.
- Rehearse by retelling before writing.
- Use words and phrases to link the tale together.
- Add detail to make the story interesting.
- Keep the characters obviously 'good', 'bad', 'silly', 'lazy'...
- Use some repetitive lines eg he huffed and he puffed...
 especially if you want the audience to join in.
- You can alter the setting and details but events must stay the same eg Snow White in New York.
- Re-read the tale aloud to see it reads well.
