




All of these words end with an 's' to show there is more than one of each thing. These are called plurals.


We are going to look at two reasons why we need to add an -s to the end of words.




If a person or thing is doing the action, we add an -s to the verb. Don't add -s if the action is done by 'I...', 'You...', 'They...' or 'We...'.


